### Minutes from December 3<sup>rd</sup>, 2006 Club Meeting

The **Sunday December 3<sup>rd</sup>** meeting of the WRC was called to order by President Fred Foster at **10:00** AM at the Laconia Airport Terminal with many members in attendance. The minutes from the **November** meeting were read by Secretary Kurt Smith. Treasurer Roger Leighton presented the treasurer's report which after the previous month's transactions showed a new balance of **\$897.99**. Both reports were duly moved, seconded, and approved unanimously by the members present with a change to reflect the correct Kids/Junior Membership dues to \$5.00.

#### **OLD BUSINESS:**

Thank you to all members that participated in the field work day on November 18th which was very successful.

Reminder the Concord auction is Saturday, January 20th at the Bow Community Center.

#### **NEW BUSINESS:**

A special meeting was held at the 4-H Fair Grounds to authorize Secretary Kurt Smith to proceed with acquiring Federal Tax Exempt Status. This is being done

to proceed with charitable gambling which the club qualifies for in the State of New Hampshire.

2007 membership dues are due prior to January 1st, 2007. Please make your payment if by check to Winnipesaukee Radio Controllers and forward it to Roger Leighton.

There is a need to amend the current By-Laws to include a limited number of members to be eligible for Federal Tax Exempt status under 501(c)(7), Social and Recreational Clubs of the Federal Tax Codes. The members present approved amending the current By-Laws to limit the membership to 200 member .

The members were asked if the Club Officers should continue to peruse Charitable Gambling to increase the clubs income to rebuild the runway and other expenses that the club may have.

Mark Kranc asked about the limitation on withdrawing of funds from the club account and getting involved with the local Boy Scout Troops. There was a substantial discussion on the subjects and there was a group censes that the club had very positive feed-back

from the summer 2006 Boy Scout Introduction to Fly and should peruse holding more events for 2007.

Snow plowing was questioned for the winter months. President Fred Foster noted that he had a conversation with the Town of Belmont plow driver for the clubs road and he will leave an 'opening' at the start of the dirt road but plowing further in would be the clubs responsibility.

It was noted that the approval has been given to cut trees 30ft back from the stone wall at the 4-H field.
